Vetting Research

- Candidates
 - Send all candidates a questionnaire
 - Offer interview upon completion of questionnaire
 - Record a 1-hr interview
- Candidates and Other Ballot Items
 - Conduct independent research



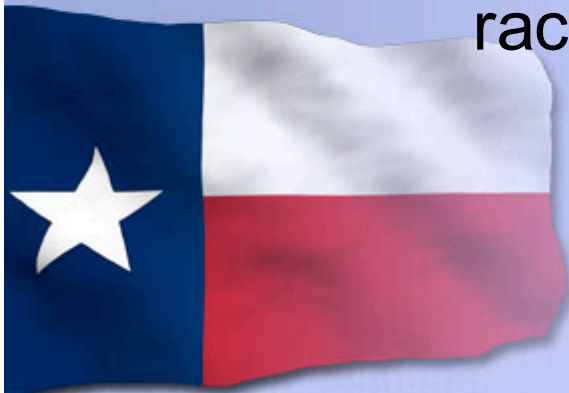
2016 Vetting Scope

- 31 Republican races monitored
 - 19 contested races
 - 57 contested candidates monitored (plus 8 presidential)
 - 54 still active (plus 8 presidential)
 - 46 responded to questionnaire (1 pending)
 - 34 interviews (+ 2 presentations @ meetings)
- 9 Democrat races logged on website
 - 2 contested
- Revamped Website
 - Zip Code Filtering



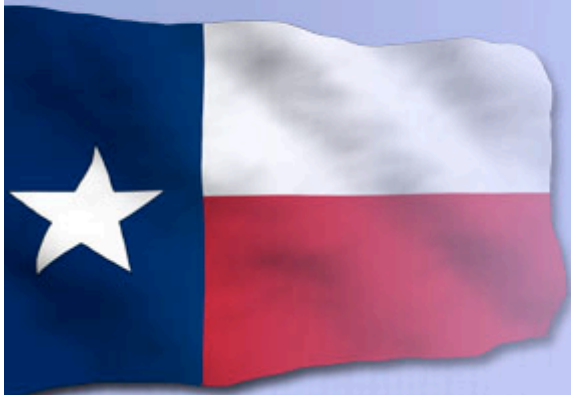
Vetting Rating System

- Each candidate is scored
 - Scale of 0-100 with 100 being “best”
 - Final score represents average of scores from each vetting committee member
- “Endorsement” requires:
 - Average score of at least 80
 - 75% or more of Vetting Committee supporting label
 - Only one endorsement vote by member for each race



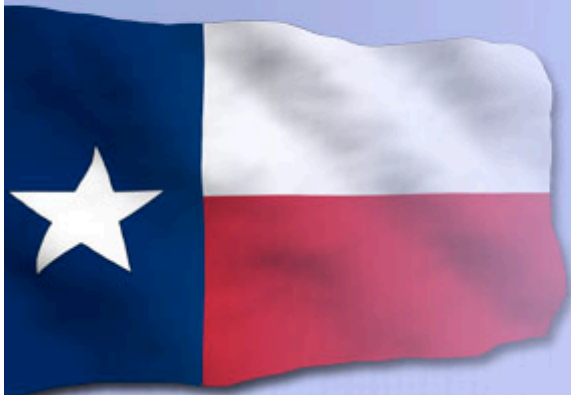
Vetting Process

- Results recommended to MCTP membership
- Results only become official if 60% or more of MCTP membership present at meeting approves



Vetting Documentation

- All data recorded on web (education first)
 - Questionnaire answers
 - Interview, presentation, and debate videos
 - Research “assertions”

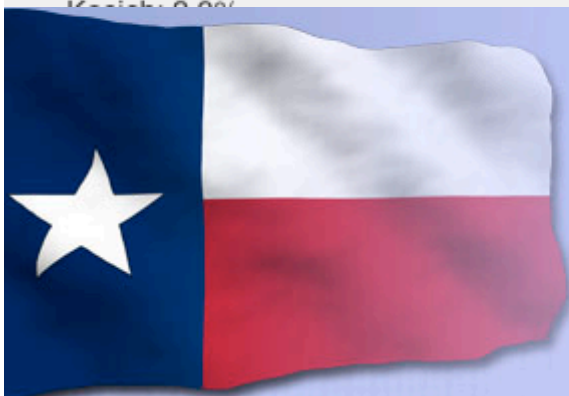

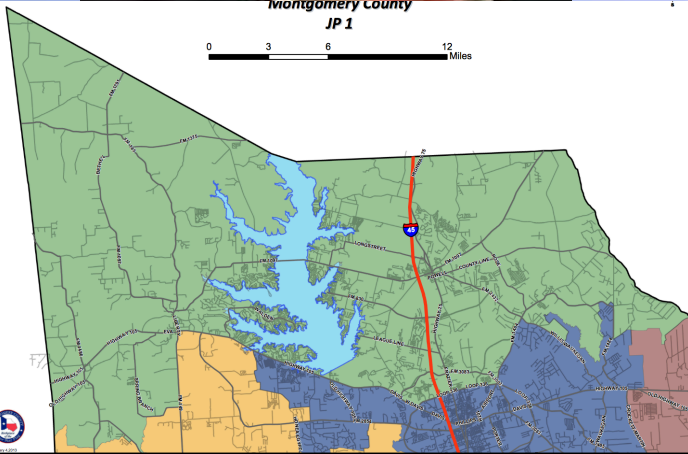

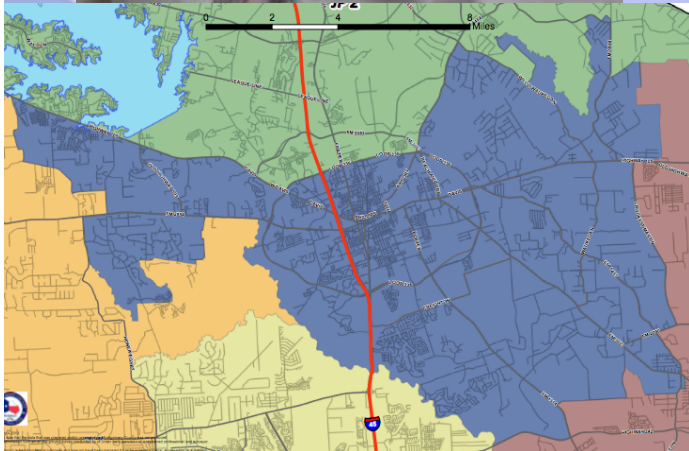

 - Discharged from Office in 2005
 - Removal upheld in 2006

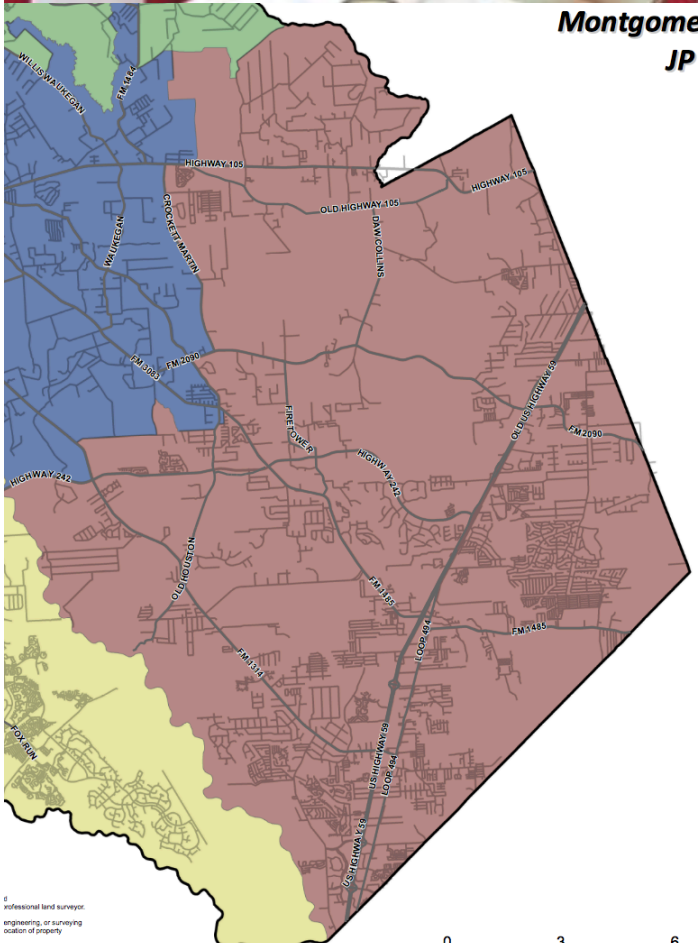

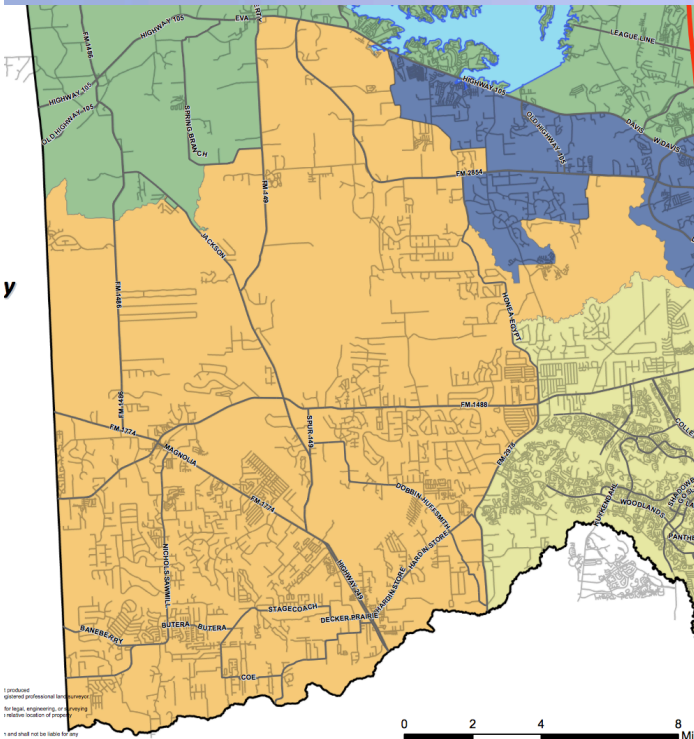

 - Henderson is part of establishment & we have concerns over current operations

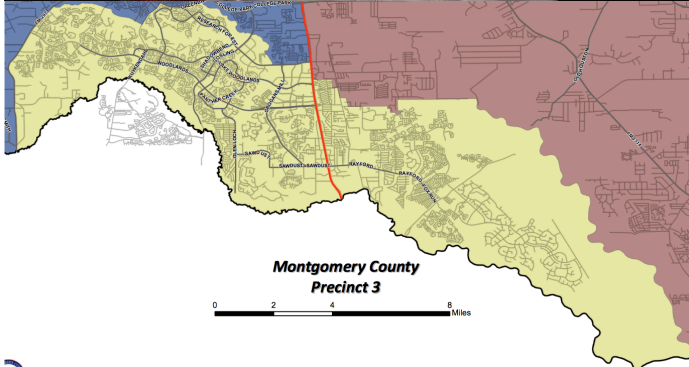

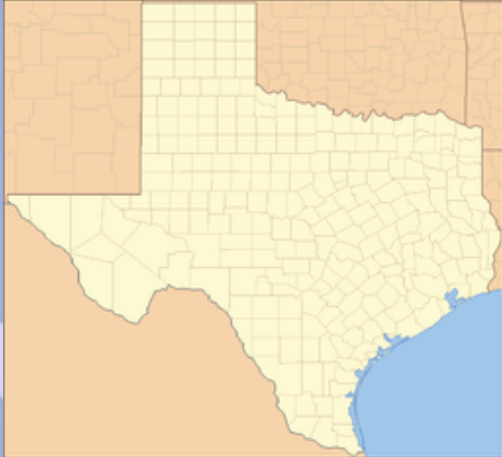

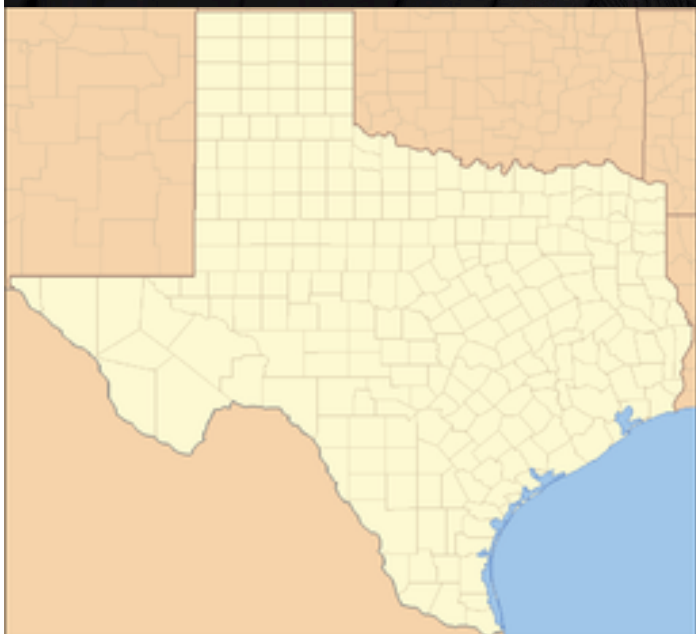

 - Recused herself in homosexual divorce case (with no reason given)



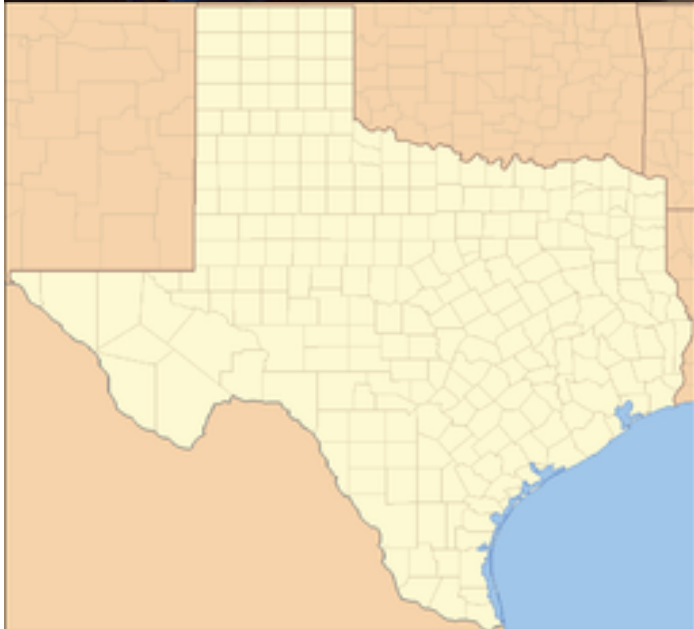

 - Supports state licensing



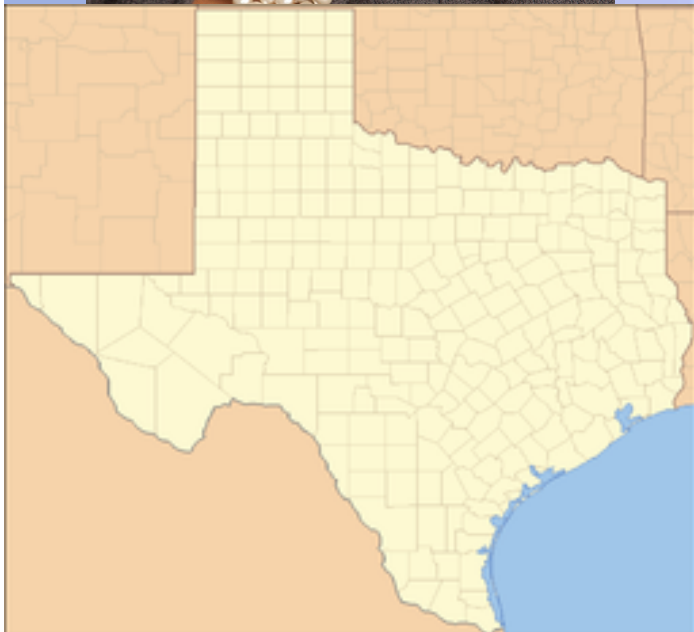
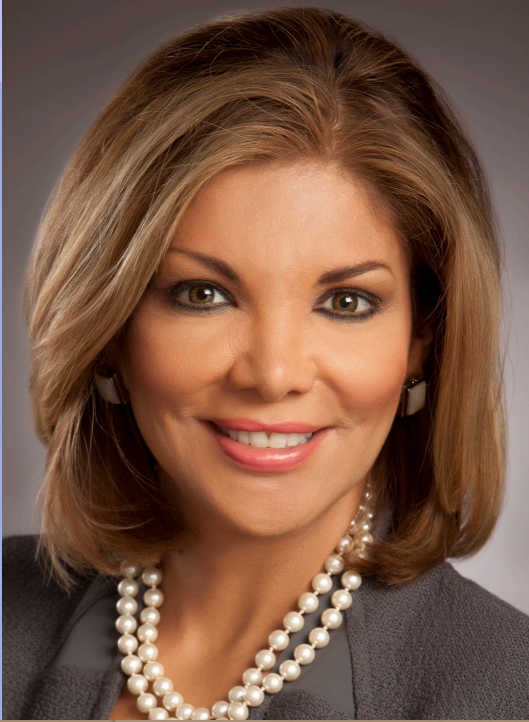

 - Mildly concerning response related to parental rights

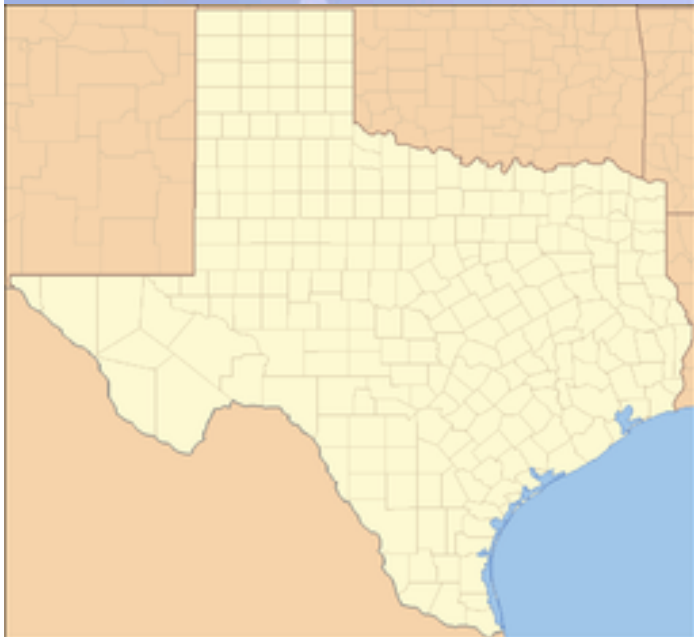

 - Willing to take on status quo

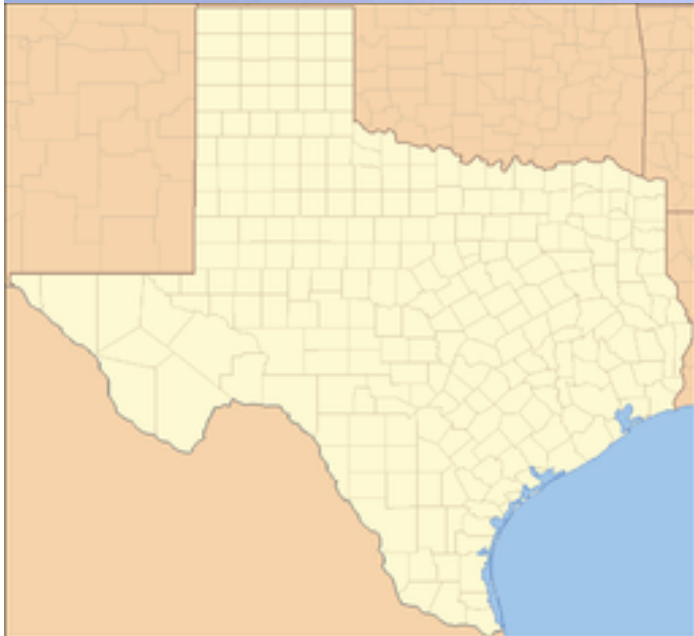

 - No information

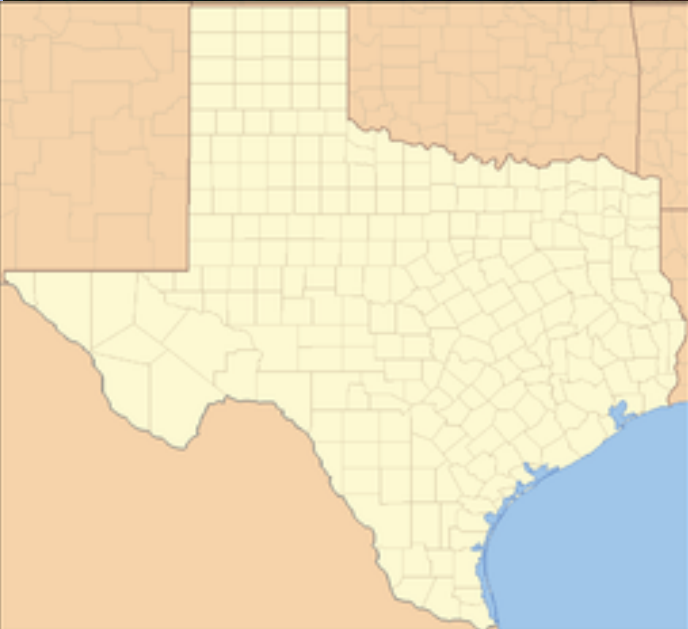
